Meet the Emcee

Nicholas Adcock serves as the President/CEO of the Greater Riverside Chambers of Commerce, where he leads an organization of more than 1,100 member organizations representing over 110,000 jobs across inland Southern California.

Adcock joined the Chamber in 2009 as the Community Development Coordinator and rose through positions of Communications & Marketing Manager and Governmental Affairs Manager before becoming the organization's Vice President in 2013 and ultimately President/CEO in 2022.

During that time, he focused on projects like securing state funding and accreditation for the School of Medicine at the University of California, Riverside, advocating for reform and relief for businesses against predatory litigation, securing local control of Ontario International Airport, and the approval of the Riverside Transmission Reliability Project.

Adcock led the effort to transition several of the Chamber's value and membership programs to virtual settings and provide the latest news, resources, and information to local businesses during the COVID-19 pandemic. He is also proud to have engaged in the Chamber's partnership with local stakeholders to attract the California Air Resources Board Southern California Headquarters to Riverside.

More recently, he worked with a coalition of stakeholders across California to advocate for critical legislation to reform the Private Attorneys General Act, a law costing businesses \$10 billion annually in fines and litigation

across the state. The Chamber also recently partnered with the City of Riverside and the Inland Empire Small Business Development Center to establish the Riverside Business Hub, a focal point for business support in the Chamber's offices.

Adcock is a fourth-generation Riverside resident with a family legacy of small business owners and service to the community. He is a product of the Riverside Unified School District and an alumnus of the Riverside Community College District and the University of California, Riverside. He graduated from the Chamber's Leadership Riverside program in 2013 and the Western Association of Chamber Executives' Academy Program in 2014.

He currently serves as a board member for the California Chamber of Commerce and a member of the Blue Zones Riverside Steering Committee. Adcock previously served as Board President for Habitat for Humanity, Riverside and President of the Pick Group of Young Professionals. He is a former board member of the Southern California Association of Chamber Executives and the Emerging Leaders Council of the Western Association of Chamber Executives. He and his wife Sydnee live in Riverside with their daughter, Marigold.



He dedicated 38 years of his life to RUSD, serving as a teacher, coach, principal, and assistant superintendent, not to mention the years that he was a successful student and athlete in the district. He prided himself on integrity and demonstrated an immense amount of compassion for both scholars and educators alike.

Did you know?

Riverside Educational Enrichment Foundation (REEF) is a 501(c)(3) California nonprofit public benefit corporation formed in 1993 to benefit the more than 40,000 students in Riverside Unified School District (RUSD). Our all-volunteer board is composed of community leaders, parents, business associates and educators.

The early success of REEF was due in part to the vision of Bonnie G. Polis, a founding member. In recognition of her commitment to the students and teachers of RUSD, our annual Teaching Enrichment Grant program was named in her honor.

Since its inception, REEF has granted close to \$3 million to RUSD in teaching grants, enhancing the educational experience of students from elementary school through high school. In recent years, REEF's role has expanded to involve other types of grants and scholarships, including:

Earthwatch Fellowships

Earthwatch is an international environmental non-profit that brings individuals together with world-class scientists to work for the good of the planet. Earthwatch offers fellowships for teachers who are passionate about teaching, excited about making a difference, and interested in conservation, environmental sustainability and life-long learning.

A combination of designated funds from private donors and REEF funds makes it possible for us to send RUSD teachers all over the globe on scientific expeditions, returning to share the experience with their students, colleagues and community. Since 2007, a total of 49 RUSD teachers have traveled literally to the ends of the world and back.
